# Varied Fluency Step 3: Using Abstract Nouns

### **National Curriculum Objectives:**

No formal objective. However, these words are taken from the Year 3/4 non-statutory spelling list and the focus is given to vocabulary of abstract concepts in line with the Spoken Language Guidance.

Spell words from the word list – Years 3 and 4.

### Differentiation:

Developing Questions to support using abstract nouns within short sentences. Including common abstract nouns (for example: excitement, happiness, morning, love). Expected Questions to support using abstract nouns within sentences. Including common and some less common abstract nouns (for example: bravery, friendship, generosity, evening, kindness, sadness).

Greater Depth Questions to support using abstract nouns within multiple sentences of varying sentence length. Sentences include more than one abstract noun using less common abstract nouns (for example: faith, courage, sacrifice, victory).
